YOU ARE CORDIALLY INVITED TO THE 32ND ANNUAL
DAY AT QUEEN EMMA SUMMER PALACE**

Saturday, October 4th from 9AM to 5PM

Every year, the Daughters of Hawai‘i extend an invitation for you to step back in history as they invite you to enjoy the historic gardens and tour QUEEN EMMA SUMMER PALACE from 9 am to 5 pm on Saturday, October 4th. All proceeds from the event go to the restoration and preservation of Queen Emma Summer Palace in Honolulu and Hulihe‘e Palace in Kailua-Kona.

The Daughters of Hawai‘i was founded in 1903 “to perpetuate the memory and spirit of old Hawai‘i, and to preserve the nomenclature and correct pronunciation of the Hawaiian language”. Currently, our largest effort is raising the funds to complete the restoration of Hulihe‘e Palace after suffering 1.5 million dollars of damage from the 2006 earthquake.

Come and join the festivities created by the Daughters and Calabash Cousins as they invite you to sample “onolicious” island foods, the sassy Bier and Wine Garten, continuous Native Hawaiian art and craft demonstrations, haku leis, plants, Victorian era vendors, specialty vendors and more. The White Elephant is filled with those special “finds” and you can purchase an outstanding event shirt, or try your chance at winning a beautiful Hawaiian quilt. Also on display in the Palace is a new exhibit of rare kapa and quilts, some dating back to Queen Emma’s era and before.

There will be continuous Hawaiian Entertainment, including: Jerry Santos, The Royal Hawaiian Band, Kaha‘i Topolinski, Tony Conjugacion, Vicky Holt Takamine, and Kula Abiva and their hālau, Kualoa, Poma‘i Keawe Lyman, Hawaiian storytellers and entertaining MC, Poni Kamau‘u.

Queen Emma Summer Palace is located at 2913 Pali Highway. Free parking for the event is located adjacent to the Palace on Pui‘iwa Road at Nu‘uanu Valley Park.
